




Creating Space for Open Conversations

Here are some ways to create an environment that feels safe for open conversations

- Actively listen to understand, not to respond
- Avoid giving advice or interrupting
- Accept the experience being shared with you
- Be mindful of your language











Creating Space for Open Conversations

- Comfortable environments like walks or car rides can help reduce anxiety
- Ensure the environment is distraction-free so the child feels heard.
- Remind them they can share concerns without fear of judgment or blame.
- Let them know you're available whenever they're ready to talk.
- Allow them to express themselves in their own words without interruptions.
- Maintain a calm demeanor; avoid displaying negative emotions to prevent making the child feel worse.
- Ask the child to explain or show details about unfamiliar topics.









Creating Space for Open Conversations

Here are some supportive phrases for meaningful conversation

- I'm here for you. What's on your mind?
- I can tell you're upset, take your time. Share when you're ready
- I'm not here to judge, I'm here to understand what's making you feel this way...
- What can I do to support you right now?
